When you get to the site you notice that the beach has been fenced off with no access for humans. With the fence there, you cannot get the up close shot you need. What should you do?

- Come back another day with a better lens that will get you that better shot from outside the fence.
- Get permission from a conservation officer to come with you to ensure you are not harming or disturbing the plovers while you get a closer shot.

- Refuse to drive on the beach and explain the threat vehicles can cause wildlife.
- Try to find another beach that the Piping Plovers are not nesting on.

An organization that helps handicapped people has just called you. They want to build a ramp on a beach to allow handicapped people access to the water. There is a school group who has come to the beach to conduct experiments on the beach sand. They have a lot of heavy equipment and want to drive on the beach to unload their equipment. This is a beach where least terns (a threatened species) have been sighted. You know it could be dangerous to the terns to allow the group to drive on the beach but the experiments being conducted by the students could also help a barrier beach. What should you do?

You have learned that a pair of piping plovers (an endangered species) have nested on a very popular and busy beach. You want to close the beach to protect the plovers but people want to use the beach. What should you do?
